Eggs galore! Following last year's successful Easter Egg Hunt, this year again the Easter bunny will hide Easter eggs all around Pinner Memorial Park for children to find on Easter **Saturday, April 15th** from 11am to 3pm.

Children (who must be accompanied) will follow the map provided to find the eggs, answer the question on the back of each egg and bring their answer sheet back to Bunny HQ at West House for an Easter prize.

The price is £3 per child (no age restriction though it is advised that the prize may not be suitable for those aged 3 or under); no prior booking is needed.

It will all be fun - racing around looking for eggs, a short quiz answering the questions on the back of each egg and bringing back the answer sheet to Bunny HQ for a small Easter prize (not sweets or chocolate!) - what family can resist? We are hoping that the Easter sun is shining to make it a memorable and good day out.
